

GIRLGUIDING MEMBERS CELEBRATE WORLD THINKING DAY

Leamington's Radford Road and Dale Street Brownies joined forces in advance of World Thinking Day on 22nd February to complete the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) Thinking Day Challenge for 2018. Following the theme of 'Impact' they played hunt the power symbol which lead to them being inspired to try Power Poses. The girls then saw for themselves the ripple effect of each of their individual pebbles dropped into water, and collectively how they caused the water to rise. Other games played with great energy helped them learn about Girlguiding's World Badge worn by 10 million members and Carbon Particle Tig followed an activity about global warming. The girls' responded enthusiastically suggesting they would make an impact by using cars less and walking and scooting more.

Celebrated since 1926, World Thinking Day is a day of international friendship, speaking out on issues that affect girls and young women, and fundraising for 10 million Girl Guides around the world. In some parts of the world members of WAGGGS are called Girl Scouts, but whatever they are called it provides girl-only space for all girls and young women, whatever their background or circumstances.

A candlelit song session concluded the evening with a collection of Thinking Day pennies towards the Thinking Day Fund supporting members in need worldwide.
